They become his benefactors, finance the ministry (for more than 30 years). The Three Wise Men from the East, are for some reason totally obscured by the Christian church.
- 2. God, our Father in Heaven, is *in* Heaven. He is a monarch, King of Heaven. Heavens and earths are created, by the Omnipresent Creator, the One, the Prime Mover whom we can never fathom or speak to. God our Father, is a senior spiritual being who lives in Heaven, In the late 1st century Sanskrit literature, God is entitled Amitabha (Almighty one of Illimitable Light), and our heaven is called Sukhavati (Land of Pure Bliss). These are new ideas for westerners, but common knowledge for easterners.
- 3. "Mary the Magdalene" comes from Magadha in North East India, the land where Siddharta Gautama hailed from. She becomes known in the West as Mari the Magadhalene because they followed a Hellenistic fashion to add 'lene' from the heroine 'Helene' to female names.
- 4. Thomas is sent East to prepare a community to receive westerners from Judea who would flee before the Romans sack Jerusalem (almost a million were killed in Jerusalem and Jews were despised all of the Roman Empire). lesous tells them, before his ascension to heaven, "...head for the mountains (of Kashmir) if you want to be safe." Thomas' "church" was known as Church of the East for a while until it was abandoned a century after the Lord' glorious return. By that time, the congregation had already assimilated with locals. Remnants of their influence are still seen in Kashmir and the Nuristan area.
- 5. On the cross, lesous utters words in a strange language, which Roman soldiers repeat to a writer. And in Gethsemane, lesous addresses the Father by a title, in a strange language, that the western disciples repeat. Not knowing Sanskrit, writers force the issue by matching the reported sounds to a language known to them, Aramaic. And they bungle it terribly. The book finally solves this mystery; he spoke in Sanskrit. He calls the Father, Light Father, or Abha Father. Which is according to the Father's title, Amitabha, Almighty one of Illimitable Light.
